# From the exec's chair (C)

Governor Steve Bullock delivered his third State of the State address to the 65th Legislature on Tuesday, January 24. Governor Bullock assured the legislature that Montana's economy is robust and growing despite declining revenues, due in part to a cooling commodities market. This has left the ending fund balance somewhere south of \$109 million well short of the \$300 million the administration had at the beginning of the biennium. It's a good thing he insisted on a \$300 million rainy day fund at the conclusion of the 2015 session. You can read a full text copy of his address here. An interesting side note to the state of the state address the following dailies serving northwest, hi-line, and eastern Montana failed to report on Governor Bullock's address or Representative Knudsen's rebuttal: Kalispell Daily Interlake, Havre Daily News, Sidney Herald, Miles City Star.

Speaker of the House Austin Knudsen (R-Culbertson) had the honor of delivering the Republican Party rebuttal to Governor Bullock's address. Representative Knudsen's message was much gloomier writing, "In the bubble of Helena and the State Capitol it can be easy to overlook reality. Good-paying state government jobs are plentiful, we sit in a beautiful building, and most of the time the Governor and his agencies have the run of the place—except for a few months every couple years when the legislature comes to town." I'm pretty sure that if they went across the street to the Montana Historical Society they would soon see that the "government workers" haven't made off the state silver set...yet!
